### 30 Years

### Bernard Livingston

[Thinking about what is most notable of my time at SU], I would have to say the satisfaction of serving the faculty, staff and students. The friendships that I made over the years, these were most notable to me. But the 3 feet of snow we shoveled through in 2010 won't soon be forgotten!

### Glen Phillips

I was 26 years old when I started as a locksmith with Salisbury University. While Interviewing for the job, I must have impressed management because I was offered the position and I was asked when I could start. I replied that I could start in a week or so because I was getting married and going on a honeymoon.

Traveling to different schools in many states, I have learned a new type of locksmithing, which is now more on the access card technology side. I was sent to Phoenix, AZ, to be a part
