The University Archives unit, part of the Nabb Center on the GAC's 4th floor, has the records of the Campus Elementary School, which began when SU opened as a teachers' college and continued in operation until 1969. In 1955, it got its own building, which eventually became Caruthers Hall, which was torn down to make way for the GAC. In fact, the GAC's terrace on the Square side follows the outline of Caruthers Hall, in case you were wondering.
