Open Access

The 10th Annual International Open Access Week is October 23-29. Open Access is a movement among scholars and librarians to make research freely available to all rather than limiting access to those institutions and individuals who can pay ever-higher subscription fees. Why Open Access? It increases the impact of research, allows more people to participate in research, and improves public health, among many benefits. The prices of academic journals have nearly quadrupled in the past 20 years, causing a huge crisis in library budgets. Open Access is one response to that.
