Sea Gulls Storm The National Scene

Sea Gulls are getting notice with alums signing pro contracts and players appearing on national broadcasts.

Football defensive back Byron Westbrook (right) signed a free-agent contract with the Washington Redskins, joining seven other players out of 75 who attended the Redskins’ rookie camp. Cut after going through preseason camp, Westbrook was given another chance as one of the eight players signed to the Redskins’ practice squad for the 2007 season. Westbrook’s older brother Brian is an All-Pro running back for the Philadelphia Eagles

Standout quarterback Dustin Johnson signed a contract with the Amarillo Dusters of the Arena Football 2 League. The two-time second team ACFC quarterback plays quarterback and wide receiver.

Alumni baseball players Cory Willey and Greg Lemon each signed professional contracts. Willey, a left-handed pitcher, signed a minor league contract with the Philadelphia Phillies. Lemon signed with the New Haven County Cutters, an independent team.



The Sullivan twin sisters, Kelly and Glenna, were featured on the *NCAA Championship Fall Seasonal Show* aired by CBS Sports. The twins represented SU at the 2006 NCAA Division III Cross Country championships.

Three Reach Coaching Milestones

Three of SU’s head coaches recently marked important milestones.

Volleyball Head Coach Margie Knight won her 200th game as SU defeated the University of Scranton, 3-1. As softball coach, Knight won her 400th career game against Mary Washington.

Field Hockey Head Coach Dawn Chamberlin notched her 300th career win defeating St. Mary’s College 6-2 in the Capital Athletic Conference semifinals at Sea Gull Field. Chamberlin is the 20th NCAA field hockey coach and eighth Division III coach to reach this elite milestone.

Baseball Head Coach Doug Fleetwood earned his 200th career victory with a 5-2 road win against Christopher Newport University.



Men's Lacrosse Champs Break Records

The 2007 Salisbury University men's lacrosse team completed a record-breaking season before 22,778 at M&T Bank Stadium in Baltimore with its fourth NCAA Division III national championship in five years. SU defeated defending national champion SUNY Cortland 15-9 and placed this year's Sea Gull squad right next to one of the best Salisbury teams of all-time, the 1995 national championship team.

Salisbury junior Matt Hickman became the sixth Sea Gull to claim the NCAA Division III Most Outstanding Player Award as he scored a game-high five goals and added one assist.

Setting Records And Knocking Them Down

Salisbury (23-0) completed the best season in the history of NCAA men's lacrosse. The Sea Gulls set a new record for wins in a season (23) and broke all three major scoring records the 1995 team held. The 1995 national championship team set the NCAA all-time records for goals (409), assists (270) and points (679) in 17 games. The 2007 Sea Gulls broke all three of those records in the championship game. Salisbury finished the season with 417 goals, 271 assists and 688 points.

"I told the guys before the game there is a lot of Sea Gull lore at Salisbury and there is a lot of tradition," said SU Coach Jim Berkman, in his 19th season at the helm.

The Salisbury senior class ends one of the



greatest runs in NCAA lacrosse history with an 83-1 four-year record. The Sea Gull's lone loss came in last season's national championship game to Cortland, 13-12 in overtime. The loss snapped Salisbury's NCAA men's lacrosse record 69-game winning streak (sixth overall in any division, any sport).

The Sea Gulls ended the season with 23 consecutive victories which ranks third all-time in NCAA Division III history for consecutive wins right behind other Salisbury national championship teams. The Sea Gulls own the lacrosse consecutive wins records of 47 games (02/24/94-05/18/96) and 69 games (04/17/03-05/28/06).

Conference Champions Again

For the second consecutive year Salisbury University captured the Capital Athletic Conference All-Sports Award, given annually to the top all-around athletic program in the conference over the course of one academic year. This is the Sea Gulls' fifth All-Sports Award since SU joined the conference as a full-fledged member in 1994-95.

The Sea Gulls won five of nine CAC titles in the spring as the nationally ranked men's and women's lacrosse, baseball and softball teams won conference titles. SU men's track and field team won their fourth CAC title in a row.

In the fall, Salisbury's field hockey team won its 12th straight CAC title. The men's and women's cross country teams swept the conference championships and women's soccer won its first crown since 2000.
