UNIVERSITY POLICIES

- Refer to the SU catalog for approved prerequisites and General Education courses.
- All graduates must have a minimum of 120 credits.
- All graduates must have a minimum of 30 credits of 300/400-level courses with C grade or above; at least 15 of those credits must be taken at SU.
- Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0 for graduation.
- Students must complete at least 30 credit hours by direct classroom instruction and/or laboratory experience.
- Students must take 30 of the last 37 credit hours at SU.
- **Bold courses are foundation courses and are required for courses later in the sequence.**

- Most students fulfill ENGL XXX and HIST XXX with courses that double count for the ENVR major.
- Students are required to complete a minor. They are encouraged, but not required, to get a double major. Thus, elective slots are indicated as optional "elective/double major" slots; and minor slots are double major slots as well, if students choose to complete a double major, rather than a minor.
- Most students chooses a minor that does include courses that double-count for General Education and/or the major; most students will have an additional elective.
- This curriculum guide does not include study abroad, though students are encouraged to do so.
