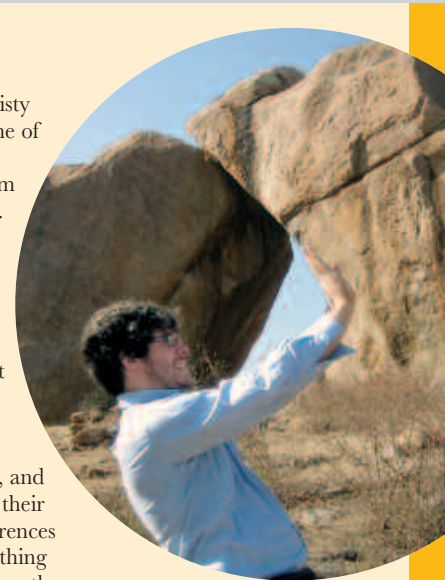
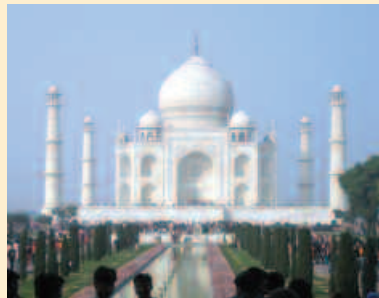


### PROFILE: ZACHARY
