SUPPORT OFFICES

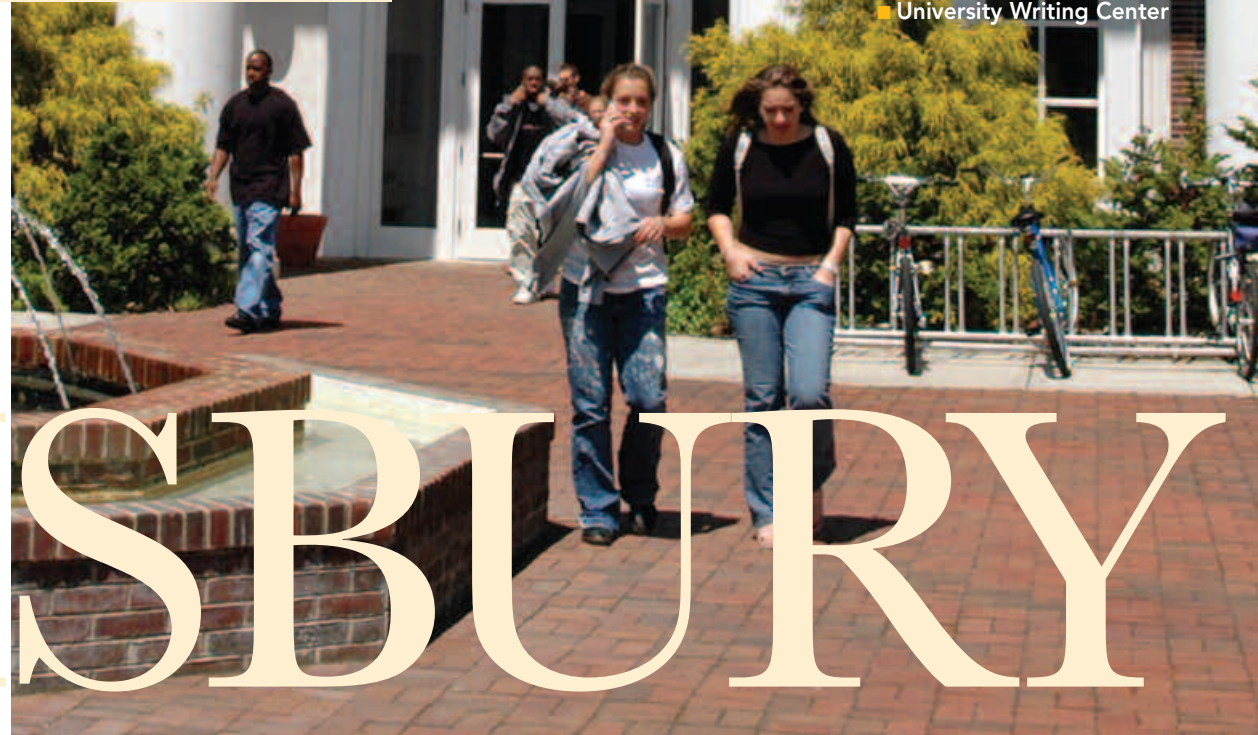

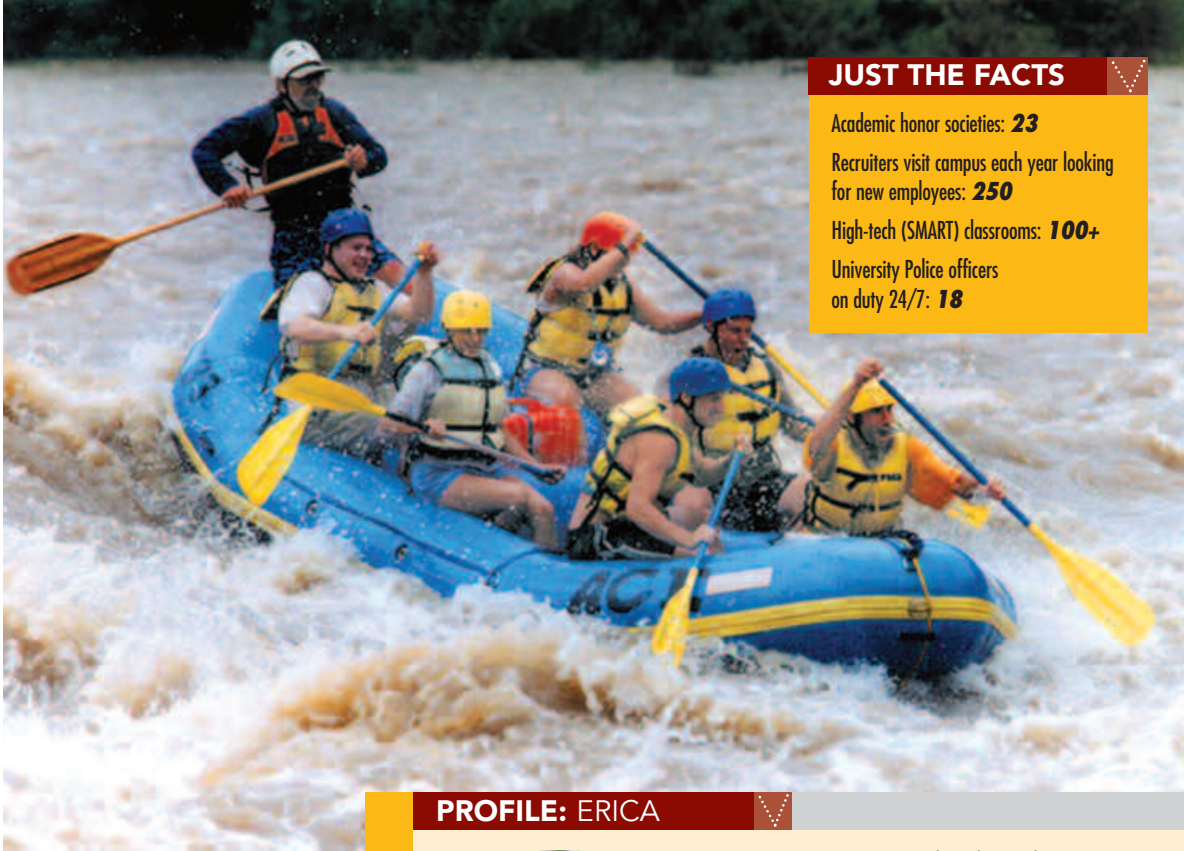
