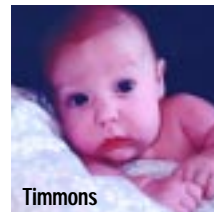

Dr. John B. May died on October 29, 2002, at the age of 93. In 1939 he joined the faculty of the Maryland State Teachers College in Salisbury as a teacher of English, philosophy and psychology. After serving with the U.S. Army from 1942-1945, he returned to Salisbury. Beginning in 1961, he served as chair of the Department of Psychology at the newly renamed Salisbury State College for nearly a decade. Dr. May retired from the University in 1974. In 1991, he and his wife, Dr. Florence Symonds May, endowed the SU Foundation for the advancement of research in specific learning disabilities. The May Literacy Laboratory is named in their honor.
