This interdisciplinary minor allows students of any major to consider the environment through multiple perspectives. Students in this minor take a minimum of 18 credits. One course is required from each of the first three categories and additional courses may be taken from any category. Be aware that some of the courses have a prerequisite. The prerequisites for each course are listed in the undergraduate catalogue. Special topic courses that are applicable to the minor may sometimes be offered through a variety of disciplines. The internship is optional, but highly recommended. Interested students should begin planning for the internship early by discussing it with their major advisor. For more information and for specific course approvals, contact the minor coordinator.

Salisbury University requires that at least 15 hours of work applied toward a minor must consist of courses that are not used to satisfy General Education requirements and at least 9 of these hours must be credits earned at the University. Grades of C or better are required in all courses applicable to the minor.
