3. All graduates must have a minimum of 30 credits of 300/400 level courses, each with "C" grade or above and at least 15 of those credits must be taken at SU.
4. Students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of a 2.0 for graduation.
5. Students must complete at least 30 credit hours by direct classroom instruction and/or laboratory experience.
6. Students must take 30 of the last 37 credit hours at SU.
7. Please see your degree progress report in GullNet for your academic progress.
8. It is the student's responsibility to satisfy graduation requirements. Please refer to your catalog for detailed major requirements.
9. Students must apply online for graduation by Nov. 15 for May graduation and May 15 for December graduation.
