M.A. CHECKLIST**

After being formally admitted to the History Program, and before beginning classes, graduate students are required to meet with the Graduate History Program Director to select one major concentration area and at least one minor concentration area.

The M.A. in History requires a minimum of 30 Semester hours of Graduate coursework in History (including 24 semester hours completed at SU) and satisfactory performance on oral and written examinations.

Program requirements for the Graduate History Program:

- A. Select at least five seminar courses at the 600-level (excluding HIST 629, 630, and 631):**

- B. The remaining semester hours (minimum of 15) may be earned as follows:**

- 1. Complete additional 600-level graduate seminars (three semester hours each).**
- 2. Complete 500-level courses. (A graduate student may not receive credit for a 500-level SU course in History and/or Anthropology that corresponds to a course taken at the 400-level [same title or topic] as an undergraduate course).**
- 3. May complete a thesis (up to six semester hours):
HIST 630 and HIST 631. 630 must be taken with 631, with 631 in the last semester of coursework. However, a student does not have to take 630 to write a thesis.**
- 4. Up to six semester hours of graduate work in History may be transferred from other institutions**

Note: HIST 590, 602, 603, 604, 605, 606, 610, and 612 may only be taken twice with different course topics. HIST 629, 630, and 631 may only be taken once.
