Interdisciplinary Social Studies Minor Department of Education

The Interdisciplinary Social Studies Minor provides students who are considering the field of teaching, the opportunity to do course work in a variety of social science disciplines in preparation for applying for the social studies teaching certificate. As certification in social studies is granted by the state, not the university, completion of the minor requirements and the appropriate teacher education courses does not guarantee certification.

The requirements for the social studies minor consist of twenty semester hours, fifteen of which must be beyond the courses used to fulfill the general education and academic major requirements. All courses in the minor must be completed with a grade of C or better. The courses taken for the minor will be determined by the student's major.

Economics major: 6cr history, 6cr human geography, 8cr political science.

Geography major: 6cr history, 6cr economics, 8cr political science.

History major: 8cr political science, 6cr economics, 6cr human geography.

Political Science: 6cr history, 6cr economics, 6cr human geography.

Elementary Education: 3cr history, 8cr political science, 6cr economics, 3cr human geography (needs a total of 6cr, but may use 3 in general education).
