POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

PBUS students seeking Perdue School B.S. majors must submit applications for admission to the professional (upper division) programs to the Director of Academic Services during the semester prior to the first semester of upper level courses. No PBUS student will be allowed to remain in 300/400-level Perdue School courses if s/he has not submitted this application.

To apply, a student **must have completed 56 credits**, including a minimum of 22 of the 28 hours in the pre-professional core. The 22 hours **must include** MATH 160 and MATH 155, ACCT 201, INFO 111 **and** ECON 211 or 212. Admission to the professional program requires a 2.6 GPA in those pre-professional core courses already completed at the time of application and no grade in the pre-professional core lower than a “C”.

Major courses and electives to complete 120 credit hours for graduation (approximately 55-60 more credits)

****CMAT 100 is required for ACCT majors (for CPA)**

INFO 211, INFO. SYS. CONCEPTS:

INFO 211 will satisfy the Information Systems special requirement for Perdue School B.S. majors except ACCT. It will not satisfy that requirement for Accounting majors. Those students majoring in Accounting will take ACCT 420, during their junior or senior year.
