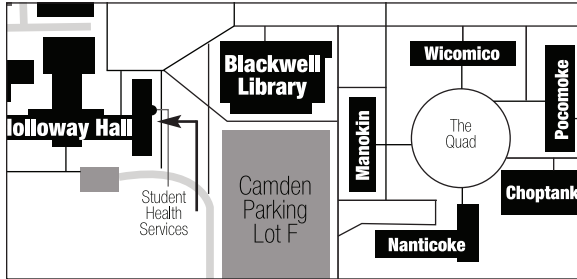


LOCATION

WELCOME

Salisbury University Student Health Services (SHS) provides confidential treatment of illnesses and injuries to all SU students through a well-equipped facility and a certified, experienced professional staff. The mission of SHS is to assist students in achieving optimal health. We do this by providing quality clinical care in an ambulatory setting and promoting wellness through education and outreach.

CONFIDENTIALITY

All information received by SHS regarding a student's health is strictly confidential. Access to medical records is limited to authorized SHS personnel. Faculty, administrators and student employees do not have access to medical records. If the student is 18 years of age or older, the University cannot release information to his or her parents without the student's prior permission. Medical information is released only with the student's written consent, upon court-ordered subpoena or when imminent danger exists.

Students are entitled to a copy of the SHS privacy statement. Medical records are kept for five years after a student leaves the University.

FREE SELF-CARE CENTER

Various packages with over-the-counter medicines for common conditions—common cold, sore throat, headache, menstrual cramps—and self-help guides, etc., are conveniently available for students. No appointment is necessary.

FEES FOR SERVICES AND ELIGIBILITY

A wide range of primary care services is available to registered students who live on and off campus. A nominal patient visit fee is charged for each visit. Students can pay by cash, check or Gull Card at the time of service. Contact SHS for elective services fees.

Off-campus health care, i.e. physicians, dentists, hospitals, radiologists and medical laboratories, will bill students or insurance companies for services and supplies. All students are urged to carry health insurance coverage. Various insurance company brochures are available at SHS.

Faculty and staff are eligible for emergency first aid, blood pressure screening, weight checks and pre-announced health education/screening activities only.

MEDICAL EMERGENCIES

If there is an apparent life-threatening situation:

1. Call an ambulance at 911.
2. Call 410-543-6222 to reach University Police.
3. If on campus, notify the resident assistant or area director as soon as possible.

URGENT SITUATIONS

If you have a medically urgent problem when SHS is not open:

1. Contact the resident assistant, resident director or area director for your residence hall; or
2. Call University Police at 410-543-6222.

TRANSPORTATION FOR MEDICAL CARE

You are responsible for transportation to the hospital or surrounding area health care facilities for x-rays, labwork, physical therapy or counseling. SHS has a list of area taxis that will offer a reduced rate to SU students for medical transport. Emergencies will be transported by ambulance.

SPECIALISTS

SHS has a list of specialists if an outside referral is recommended. (Note: The student will be responsible for these medical bills.)

MEDICAL EXCUSES

Excuses for class absences are not routinely written. In those rare instances when an instructor feels it necessary to verify a medical absence, the SHS director should be contacted. No information will be released without prior written consent from the student.
