The library homepage has a tab up at the top that is called “E-Resources – this is where you want to go to find journal articles.



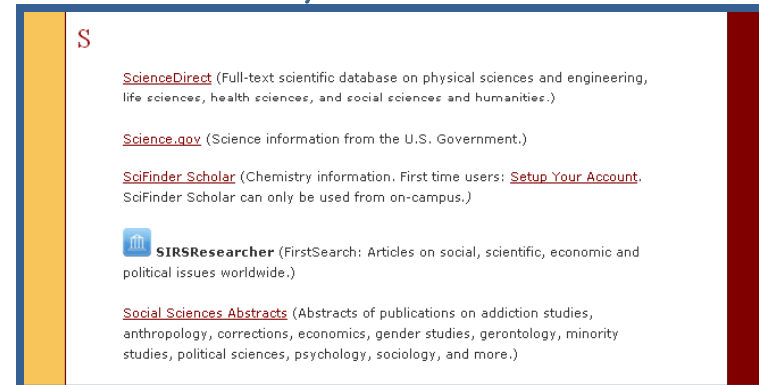

On the page above, click on the link that says “[Databases by Subject and Title](#)”. Once you get to that page, click on the letter S .

The database you want to use for your search is called ‘[Science Direct](#)’ – it has a great deal of scholarly journal articles, most of which contain formal statistical analyses of the scholarly research results...

When you are at the Science Direct search screen, you are all set to begin searching! Just make sure to type in the name of one of your statistical analyses (“t-test”, “z-test”, etc .) in the ‘All fields’ box (and put the name of the analysis in quotation marks!) along with an academic topic of interest. [Ex: “t-test” and “elementary education”]. Once you’ve typed in your search terms, just click on the Go button - you’ll have lots of great full-text search results to choose from!
