An Educational Visit

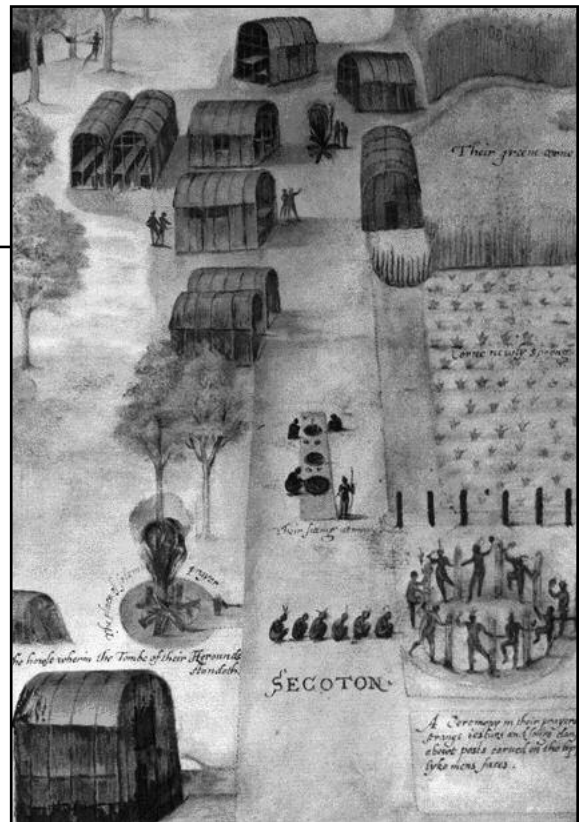

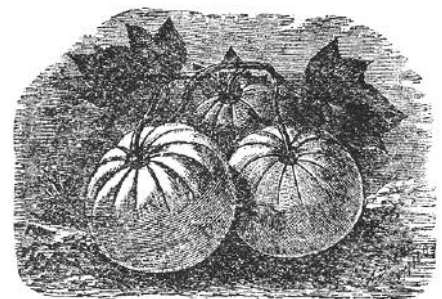

As part of his very large, decades-long personal collection of 18th to early 20th century tools, George Bacon of Norfolk, VA, recently donated a sampling of tools and part of his library. Dr. Ray Thompson, in his graduate History 601 seminar, used these new acquisitions to demonstrate these items of material culture to his students.
