Dorothea McDowell, Ph.D., RN is currently a professor of nursing at Salisbury University, having taught on the faculty for almost 20 years. She received her Bachelor's degree in Nursing from the University of Virginia, Charlottesville and both a Master's and Ph.D. in nursing from the University of Maryland, Baltimore. Her Ph. D. specialty is Nursing Informatics or the study of computers, information and nursing science. Her clinical area of expertise is adult acute care, especially in the area of general surgery. Current research areas include nurses' acceptance of computerized charting, perceived quality benefits of computerization in health care and computer literacy of nursing students. Also having a love for global health care issues, she has traveled to Tanzania, Honduras and China. She made her third trip to China in May, 2009 taking a group of students to observe Traditional Chinese Medicine and dialogue with nursing students in China.

Katie Hinderer, PhDc, RN, CCRN is currently an instructor of nursing at Salisbury University. She received her Bachelor's degree in Nursing from the University of Maryland, Baltimore, her Master's degree in Nursing from Wilmington University and is a candidate for a Ph.D. in nursing from the University of Maryland, Baltimore. Traveling US 50 / Eastbound --- Approaching Salisbury **stay to the right** entering Salisbury on **US 50 BUSINESS**. (DO NOT TAKE EXIT TO US 50 BY-PASS).
