## PRE-OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY REQUIREMENTS

- Preparation for graduate programs in this field requires that certain prerequisite courses be completed and that the applicant take the necessary admissions exam required by the intended graduate school.
- Required courses were required in >70% of graduate programs surveyed.
- Recommended courses are suggested for proper preparation for graduate/doctoral programs and were required in >50% of graduate programs surveyed or would enhance the application.
- Suggested courses are recommended for proper preparation for graduate/doctoral programs.
- You must check the prerequisites of all schools you are considering, as requirements vary.
- Admission exams like the GRE are often not required, but you should check with your target schools so that you allow time to prepare for this, if needed.
- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 to be considered as a viable candidate for graduate/doctoral programs. IMPORTANT NOTE: Some schools require B or better in the pre-requisite courses and some require a minimum GPA during the last 60 hours of the B.S. degree, so an overall GPA of 3.0 for 120 hours may not be sufficient.
