## PRE-MEDICINE REQUIREMENTS

- Preparation for medical school requires that certain pre-requisite courses be completed and that the applicant take the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT). See the MCAT website for additional information: https://students-residents.aamc.org/applying-medicalschool/article/whats-mcat-exam/
- Recommended courses are strongly suggested for proper preparation for graduate/doctoral programs.
- · You must check the prerequisites of all schools you are considering, as requirements vary.
- Maintain a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 to be considered as a viable candidate for graduate/doctoral programs.
- Interview with the Health Professions Advisory Committee (HPAC) (at least one interview throughout undergraduate career – must maintain 3.25 to be eligible to interview). Students are strongly encouraged to meet with an HPAC advisor and participate in a mock-interview prior to sitting for the HPAC interview.
- Suggested patient observation, shadowing, and volunteer hours: 1000 minimum (1500-2000+ to be competitive)
- Refer to program of choice for suggested patient contact, shadowing, and volunteer hours required.
- Demonstrate teamwork and communication skills throughout patient contact
- Possible minor: Chemistry (obtained with completion of all CHEM courses listed); Spanish; Psychology; Sociology, etc.
- · Explore leadership and study abroad opportunities that enhance undergraduate experience.
- All pre-health students should seek further advisement and guidance provided by Health Professions Program advisors (HPP: https://www.salisbury.edu/academic-offices/advising-center/hpap/).
