

### *Secrets of Salisbury* Participant:

Thank you so much for registering for the *Secrets of Salisbury* walk on Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup> at 10am, sponsored by the Office of the Provost and Senior Vice President of Academic Affairs. This event is scheduled rain or shine.

Here is what you need to know for a fun, safe, and interesting experience:

#### Before the event:

- Be sure you are registered for the event. This event is only open to Salisbury University students, faculty and staff.
- Come dressed appropriately for the weather, since we will walk rain or shine. In the unlikely event of extreme weather, we would notify you in advance of cancellation. You will get a t-shirt when you arrive.
- Wear comfortable clothes and shoes, ready to walk 1.5 – 2 miles.
- Bring a refillable water bottle.
- Bring your charged cell phone, and perhaps a charger. You can use your phones for digital maps and to take photos.
- Download digital maps for the campus or downtown walk [here](#).
- Save these numbers in your contacts: SU Campus Police at 410-543-6222 if you need help. Dial 911 in an emergency.

#### 10:00-10:20 am: Introduction to *Secrets of Salisbury*

- 9:45 am: Doors open to the Guerrieri Academic Commons (Library) on the 4th floor in the Assembly Hall.
- If you arrive before 9:45, you can view local historical artifacts outside the doors of the Assembly Hall, courtesy of the [SU Nabb Research Center](#) for Delmarva History and Culture.
- Once inside, help yourself to a light breakfast of granola bars, apples, and bananas.
- We supply bottled water, but highly encourage you to bring your own refillable water bottle.
- Meet new people and take a seat at any table.
- 10:00 am: Program begins with Dr. Andrew Martino, Dean of the Clarke Honors College, to explain *Secrets of Salisbury* as an observational, self-guided, small group walking tour.
- After receiving instructions, we will dismiss everyone to form small groups of 3 or 4 people. Remember, the smaller the group, the more you can interact and observe. We encourage you to walk with people you do not know yet. We can assist you with forming a group, if needed.

#### 10:30-12:30 pm: Walkabout

- *Secrets of Salisbury* offers two strands (thematic walking routes): Salisbury University Campus or Downtown Salisbury. You should have already selected your option, but are welcome to change your mind. If you want to try both walks in 2 hours, start with downtown first, so that you are back on campus no later than 12:30 pm.

- On your reservation form, you should have indicated if you need accommodations, which we will arrange. For the campus tour, we have a golf cart, and for the downtown tour, we have a van, to assist people as needed.
- If needed, you can return to the room at any point. If you have unexpected transportation needs during the walk, call or text Professor Lauren Hill at 443-235-0588. You can call SU Campus Police at 410-543-6222 if you need help. Dial 911 in an emergency.
- Campus walk: Notice public art (sculpture, paintings, signs, glass, murals) and sustainability efforts (arboretum, gardens, recycling and trash stations, water refill stations, solar stations). Think about green spaces in contrast to the buildings. Where are places to congregate or to find solitude? The main academic buildings are open for you to visit, get water, and use restrooms.
- Downtown walk: Why is Salisbury here? What did you see that is beautiful? What is missing? The SU Entrepreneurship Center and Art Gallery buildings are open for you to visit, get water, and use restrooms.
- You can submit your **one** favorite photo of the trip, to Professor Jeanne Anderton anytime on Sunday. Consider taking some documentary-style photos to capture places and social interaction photos that highlight people. Photos should capture your impressions of a new space and how you interact with it. Photographs can be of anything: the person at the desk, behind the counter, in the street or classroom, or of architecture, parked cars, litter, plants and trees, green spaces, recycling, designs, or colors. Be mindful of requesting permission to photograph, if appropriate, especially if subjects are minors. Respect the photographic subject (person or place) and submit photographs without digital manipulation, as close to the original experience as possible. Select photos will be shared in a slide show, on the website, and in the Nabb Center archive, and may be used for other promotional purposes by Salisbury University. More details about where to send the picture will follow.

12:30-1:00 pm: Discussion of *Secrets of Salisbury*

- The room will be open earlier for anyone who needs to return.
- 12:30 pm: Lunch includes pizza, cookies, and bottled water.
- During lunch, we will discuss what you noticed about campus and the community.
