HOW ARE INTERNS PLACED?

You will be placed based on career goals/preferences and an assessment survey. They will select your location during their AIFS application process and examine good fits.

REQUIREMENTS?

- ✓ Junior status & 2.5 overall GPA
- ✓ Other departmental requirements may affect how credits are distributed.

DEADLINES?

Deadline for fall is **March 15**; deadline for spring is **October 15**

Deadlines are flexible!

HOW DOES SU COUNT CREDITS?



4-8 credits for internship

4 credits for IDIS 399 seminar reflecting on your experience with Dr. Cox

4 credits of survival language training for non-English-speaking countries

LANGUAGE BARRIERS?

Some places have language training, but not all.

Some require proficiency before going, but many do not.

Language should not be a barrier for working abroad in most cases.

HOW MUCH WILL I WORK?

About 40 hours per week.



WILL I BE ON MY OWN WHEN I GET TO MY LOCATION?

NO! GE representatives will check-in with interns throughout the program, planning networking and social events for all interns.

Interns may participate in a welcome orientation once arriving and other check-in's and debriefings.

Dr.Cox will also be in regular contact with interns and may visit sites occasionally.

COST?

Costs are comparable to a semester at SU full-time.

Some costs vary by country.



GRANTS/ SCHOLARSHIPS?

Flight credits, grants, and other funding opportunities are available through GE and SU.

There are also opportunities to apply for existing financial aid and grants/scholarships to the program.
