MAJOR REQUIREMENTS

- Complete all prerequisites for courses used in IDIS.
- Complete 30 credits or more in 300-/400-level courses with grades of C or better, including IDIS 335 and 435 (four credits each).
- Up to 18 credits of upper-division courses (300/400 level) may be used, with at least 12 credits taken as an IDIS major at Salisbury University.
- No more than two of the courses may be used to meet minor or other major requirements.
- Any changes in a student's individual program must be approved in writing by the major coordinator of the IDIS program.
