Greetings and congratulations on another successful year!

With ~1300 students graduating in May, we wrapped up another academic year. My thanks to each of you for the important roles you played in our students' success. Thanks as well to our head marshals (Lisa Marquette and Scott Mazzetti (CHHS), Shawn McEntee (Fulton), Yaping Jing (Henson), Aaron Johnson (Perdue), and Amber Meyer (Seidel)), mace bearers (Lisa Seldomridge (CHHS), Kathleen Shannon (Henson) and Kashi Khazeh (Perdue)), and everyone who attended or volunteered their service for these important events.

In addition to successfully supporting students to graduation, we also see positive **new student enrollment trends** for Fall 2023 in all areas (first-time, transfer, graduate, regional centers, out-ofstate, under-represented groups, and international) relative to the same time last year. Thanks to our Admissions team, the Office of Graduate Studies & Research, all the graduate directors, Regional Centers staff, and everyone who has supported a robust incoming.

I'm also very appreciative of <u>all the work</u> that has gone into developing a framework for course approval and the more than 225 courses proposed for our **new General Education curriculum** (new GE One-sheet is attached). This work represents a tremendous effort by the course proposers, the <u>General Education Oversight Committee</u> and its subcommittees, the Faculty Senate, and staff in the Provost's and Registrar's Office who support the workflows and platforms associated with the curriculum review process, Gullnet, and the Academic Catalog.

Thanks as well to the 2022-2023 **Faculty Senate** (FS) which had a very productive year. Their efforts resulted in the approval of several recommendations that increased special session (Winter and Summer) compensation, facilitated decision-making for the new GE curriculum, incorporated statements on Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) in the Faculty Handbook, and ensured the inclusion of DEI in annual, tenure, and promotion evaluations. FS President **Jennifer Martin** (SU Libraries) did an amazing job facilitating discussions and leading the meetings. Please join me in thanking Jennifer and all the Faculty Senators for a job well done and welcoming AY23-24 FS Officers, President **Deneen Long-White** (Public Health), Vice President **Joerg Tuske** (Philosophy), Secretary **David Keifer** (Chemistry), and Webmaster **Jeffrey Emmert** (Physics).

The tally's not quite in for external grant and contract awards for FY23, but this year will be a recordbreaker with more than \$11M in external funds received. My thanks to all of you who worked on proposals and funded projects and to the crack team in the Office of Sponsored Projects for facilitating pre- and post-award processes and project success.

The end of the semester is also a different kind of finals season at SU. **Men's Lacrosse** won the NCAA Division III Championship for the 13<sup>th</sup> time beating Tufts on May 28! This week, **SU Softball** is competing in the NCAA Division III Championship in Marshall, TX. SU **Baseball**'s path to the national championship came to an end late last night with a loss in Cedar Rapids, IA.

Finally, because this is my last First Monday email, I'd to take this opportunity to express my **heartfelt thanks to each of you for your commitment to our students, mission and academic excellence**. It's been the privilege of my career to serve as Provost at Salisbury University and to support and witness the tremendous work that happens here each and every day. I'll continue to work on our Middle States re-accreditation and other projects through the end of 2023. Thank you!

Please join me in welcoming Laurie Couch when she takes the helm as SU Provost on July 12<sup>th</sup>.

## **Congratulations and Other News to Share**

- Last week, SU's **Institute for Public Affairs and Civic Engagement** (PACE) was awarded the 2023 *We the People* Award by the American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU). This award recognizes a strategic team commitment to prioritizing, institutionalizing, and advancing student civic learning and community engagement in regional, state, and national communities. Congratulations to Director **Sandy Pope** (Secondary & Physical Education), former Co-Director **Sarah Surak** (Political Science), **Maarten Pereboom** (Fulton School), and the entire PACE Team, past and present. This is a terrific national endorsement of the Civic & Community Engagement requirement in our GE curriculum and all the great work done at <u>PACE</u>.
- Christy Weer has shared her intention to step down from the Perdue deanship after AY23-24 and will return to the faculty in the Department of Management. Dr. Weer has led the Perdue School through a remarkable period of growth and success which included continuing AACSB accreditation (with a separate accreditation for Accounting); launch and growth of the Mid-Atlantic Sales & Marketing Institute (MASMI) professional sales program and the National Shore Sales Challenge; launch of our online MBA program (ranked as a top program by USN&WR since 2017) and the Business Honors Program (Clarke Honors College); and fundraising and external grants that exceeded \$20M during her tenure.   SU's Student Entrepreneurship Competitions. For an idea of impact, the 2022 Shore Hatchery
  Annual Report indicated 678 jobs created, \$1.787 M awarded to 94 businesses, with 79% of those
  identifying as women, minority, or veteran-owned businesses. Please join me in thanking Bill for
  the tremendous impact and legacy he and his team have had on our campus and region.
- Inadvertently missed in our list of retiring faculty last month was **Mary Avara** (Music, Theatre & Dance). Mary has been our 'resident ballerina' for 30 years and has inspired countless dancers through her roles as instructor, choreographer, and artistic director.
- Students in **Mike Lewis**' Environmental Studies Seminar collaborated with Bryan Russo and Matt Heim (Delmarva Public Media) on a radio documentary about the <u>Wicomico River: The Soul of Salisbury</u>. It's a great program give it a listen!
- If you are looking for some inspiration, check out **Dean Ravizza**'s Adapted Physical Education course where his students work with many local children. The power of sports and Adapted PE are so clear on the faces of the kids as they engage in wide varieties of activities crafted to meet their needs and abilities. Great job!

- Each May SU participates in <u>Thank a Teacher Week</u>. This year, 261 faculty and instructional staff received messages of appreciation from our campus community. I want to extend my thanks to ID&D and to all who participated in helping demonstrate the deep gratitude and recognition our faculty and instructional staff deserve for their tireless commitment to our students' education and well-being.
- As noted above, admission of <u>new students</u> looks strong for Fall, 2023. Despite this growth, we **expect to be down 3-4% in overall enrollment** as a result of recent large graduating classes and enrollment losses in previous years. Of course, this has impacts on our budget for the upcoming fiscal year (FY24). Your deans and unit leaders have worked hard to meet our initial budget target. We are hopeful that additional funds will be available after the Fall 2023 census and assessment of the status of other revenues. We expect growth in our overall enrollment after AY23-24.
- And finally, SU recently implemented a Back to Flying Scholarship (\$1,000) for students who were on academic probation in one semester and worked their way back to the Dean's List! the next. We were delighted to see that 17 students won this scholarship after the Spring Semester (average GPA increased from 1.28 to 3.73).
