Greetings Colleagues: I hope your summer is going well and not too quickly! Although there is a lot of activity on campus, I trust that all of you are getting some well-deserved downtime.

Last month, we sent an **email to all incoming and returning students** (see attached for an example) noting that while one of the greatest predictors of student success is engagement, we recognize that for many students there may be a bit of trepidation in the transition to engaging with others and returning to "normal" activities. We stressed that SU faculty and staff are committed to student success; I know the great job each of you will do in what will be a welcome (but possibly challenging) return to in-person instruction for many students.

Sorry for this nudge but.....as noted last month, the mechanism used by the USM to measure faculty productivity has changed. It's critical that faculty complete the **Annual Survey of Faculty Productivity** to allow us to accurately describe your work — well beyond the number of courses taught. The aggregated data are presented in several high-level reports. To date, less than 15% of faculty have completed this for AY20-21 (completed in Digital Measures, see attached email). If you haven't done so already, we ask that you complete your entries in DM by July 16th. Please email provost@salisbury.edu with any questions and THANK YOU for providing this important information.

Please join me in congratulating **Memo Diriker** on 32 years as Director of the Perdue School's Business, Economic and Community Outreach Network (BEACON). Memo stepped down from this position at the end of June and will continue to serve as a member of the Management & Marketing faculty. Under his leadership, BEACON completed more than 500 projects and won more than \$16M in external funding. Perhaps his greatest impact was in community building and student development.
