Congratulations and Other News to Share

- Congratulations to **Jill Caviglia-Harris** (Economics and Environmental Studies) on being named a Fulbright Scholar to Brazil for the 2023-2024 Academic Year. This award recognizes Jill's long-running research program examining the tradeoffs between development and the ecological impacts of deforestation in the Brazilian Amazon.
- As noted above, **Kelly Fiala** will soon be retiring from her position as Founding Dean of the College of Health & Human Services (CHHS); she will be taking on a new leadership role at Northern Illinois University. While we are delighted that Kelly will have this opportunity for professional growth and to be closer to family, we regret that we will lose such a tremendous leader and advocate for our nursing, health sciences, and social work programs. Kelly was involved in the earliest conversations about the importance of establishing a unit that coalesced all healthcare and human services programs at SU and has been the driving force behind the successful launch of the CHHS. We wish her and **Laura Marinaro** the best in their next chapter.
- I'm pleased to announce that **Lisa Seldomridge** has accepted the position of Interim Dean of the CHHS. Lisa brings vast experience to this role including her exceptional accomplishments as a teacher, scholar, and service contributor as Professor of Nursing, Chair of Nursing, Nursing Graduate Director, Founding Director of SU's Henson Medical Simulation Center, and as principal

- investigator/Co-PI on ~\$15M in external funding. Her contributions have been recognized by the USM Regents' Award for Faculty Excellence in Teaching, the Maryland Higher Education Commission's Nurse Faculty Award, SU's Distinguished Professor Award, and Lucy Tull Distinguished Faculty Awards among others.
- Thanks and congratulations to the team at the Institute for Public Affairs and Civic Engagement Sandy Pope (Secondary & Physical Education), Sarah Heim, Alexia Rawlings, Judy McClure, and Ryan Weaver for two terrific events last week. Last Thursday, the PACE Showcase celebrated SU's Presidential Citizen Scholars, the Nonprofit Leadership Alliance, ShoreCorps/Americorps, Langenberg Fellow, and networking with community organizations. Last Friday, Governor Moore spoke at the Lower Shore Nonprofit Summit 2023: Together, for Good which was hosted by PACE. He noted that on his 100th day in office, he wanted to be at SU where service to the community, which is a key part of his vision for the State, is such a vital component of our work.
- And speaking of PACE and non-profit programming, we recently received two other pieces of good news. Our Certified Nonprofit Professional program, led by **Carolina Bown** (Communication), was recognized as having the largest number of enrollees of any of the 32 campuses in the Nonprofit Leadership Alliance (which includes large campuses like Arizona State and U of Central Florida). In addition, we recently learned that SU's Shorecorps has the largest number of members of any Americorps program in Maryland.
- SU's Student Research Conference (SUSRC) 2023 was a terrific event with 72 poster and 44 oral presentations (the program can be found here). Congratulations to **Angela Freeman** (Biological Sciences) who was selected as the 2023 Outstanding Research Mentor. And many thanks to the faculty mentors and to the entire SUSRC team led by co-chairs **Sherry Maykrantz** (Public Health) and **Tim Werner** (Exercise Science).
- This year, nearly 50 students submitted applications for nationally competitive fellowships. Thus far, two Fulbright Student awardees and two alternates have been confirmed and one Boren Scholarship winner and one alternate have been named. My sincere thanks to **Kristen Walton** (History) and all the faculty mentors and others who support students pursuing these highly competitive awards. My thanks as well to the students who put so much work into their applications. As Kristen is quick to note, the process of applying and the accomplishment of finishing an application can be more important than the win.
- Congratulations to **Giulia Franchi** and colleagues in Computer Science and Mathematical Sciences for supporting SU's Robotics team which competed last month in the VEX U World Championship in Dallas, TX.
- My thanks to everyone who participated in SU's Third Annual Anti-Racism Summit held on April 17th. It was inspiring to see the students, faculty, staff, and community members engaging in critical conversations. To those of you who make inclusivity a priority in your teaching, I appreciate your commitment to creating a more equitable learning environment. - Turnitin recently added an Artificial Intelligence (AI) detection report to their Originality Report
