ME: Wow, congrats! Well with all this success, is there anyway that you think studying abroad in London may have influenced this?

MATT: Absolutely. Actually it was in London that I decided I wanted to switch from Business Econ major to Business Marketing. While at Brunel, I

surrounded myself with people who marketed for multiple different companies and in different countries and I realized that is what I

wanted to do, not economics. If I hadn't switched, I doubt I would have been a part of Connect U.

ME: Oh wow, so London definitely impacted this. I remember while living in London, you used to travel to different countries to give speeches for companies. Did this have any influence on your Connect U success?

MATT: Definitely. I gave a speech in Hamburg, Germany in front of over 100,000 people, which helped with the entrepreneurship competition because I felt fully prepared.

MATT: At first yeah, especially because they didn't speak English so I would talk some and then a translator would follow. If I made a joke, I had to wait through a slight awkward moment for the translator to tell it. It was really after this that I realized I love talking in front of people, I love being able to inspire so many.

ME: So what's Matt Greene's next move?

MATT: Finish out school here and my time as captain of the soccer team, build up Connect U with my great partners, hopefully travel more, and just have fun.
