It proceeds on the theory that gender is socially constructed, and that social constructions of gender have served as justification for cultural, economic, political, psychological, and social violence. These constructions have also been used to delineate accepted rules of responsibility for violence and abuse, and to support and justify claims to unequal power and privilege. Several gender-based assumptions have served to create gender dichotomies when it comes to such subjects as war and peace, heroism, patriotism, innocence and vulnerability. Gendered images of war and violence have not only privileged men and boys as warriors, but they have also

NOTE: This course introduces students to the conflict condition commonly known as "terrorism", and the various challenges that nation states face as they deal with terrorist challenges. The course will be structured on a two-track approach. The first track of the course is both conceptual and definitional, in which we seek to understand terrorism on a rather theoretic level. It will involve an exploration of the ways terrorism is defined in legal, policy, and research terms. Such questions as: what perspectives of international relations and conflict resolution theories best capture the phenomenon of terrorism in today's international environment - Francis Fukuyama's end of history, Samuel Huntington's clash of civilizations, or Thomas Friedman's impact of globalization? It will also cover issues of broad terrorist strategies and specific terrorist tactics.
