Why should I consider dual enrollment?

- Earn college credit while earning high school credit!
- Save money! Salisbury University gives dual enrollment students a more than 50% discount.
- If you receive free or reduced meals through WCPS, your tuition is covered by WCPS.
- Level 4, weighted courses look great on your transcript.
- Courses are taught by WCPS teachers who ensure you have the proper support and guidance through your first college experience.
- Transfer the credits you've earned to any other university.
- Learn the time-management skills, study skills and discipline you'll need to succeed in college.
- Improve your chance of qualifying for scholarships or awards.
- Free up enough time in college for you to take part in programs like study abroad or to double major.
- Graduate from college on time or early, which will save you money.



What is the difference between dual enrollment and concurrent enrollment in Worcester County Public Schools?

- **Dual Enrollment** is when a student enrolled in a public high school takes a college course on a high school campus in Worcester County. The course is taught by a high school teacher who holds the credentials that Salisbury University requires of their adjunct professors.
- **Concurrent Enrollment** is when a student enrolled in a public high school in Worcester County enrolls in a college course on a community college or university campus.

If I take a dual enrollment course, will it appear on my high school transcript that is sent to colleges?

Yes, the course title, grade and high school credit awarded will be recorded. This course is a level 4, weighted course and will be considered into your high school GPA.

What grade do I have to earn in a dual enrollment course to receive credit from Salisbury University?

The grade you earn in the dual enrollment course will be recorded as your grade in the college equivalent. Therefore, credit can be earned with any grade other than an E/F.

How do I enroll in a dual enrollment course?

Contact Ms. Howard in the WTHS Guidance Office for information on eligibility requirements and necessary forms, which includes:

- WCPS's Dual Enrollment Certification Form (signed by school dual enrollment contact)
- SU's High School Students Application for Concurrent Enrollment Form
- Non-Degree Registration Form
- Maryland Residency Form

How much does SU Dual Enrollment cost and how do I pay?

The current rate is \$135 per credit hour, a 50% discount from the regular in-state per-credit rate. Students eligible for free and reduced meals have the tuition paid by Worcester County. Parents WILL NOT receive a paper tuition bill. Students (not parents!) receive a SU GullNet account through which bills can be accessed/paid under the finance option in the student center. Tuition for fall semester/entire year courses is due October 1 and for spring semester courses on March 1. Those who fail to pay on time will be disenrolled from the SU portion of the course and credit will not be awarded. This will have no effect on your enrollment at WTHS.
