Requirements

- ♦ Applicants must have a **strong interest** in serving the community, be at least **18 years of age**, and have **reliable** transportation.
- ♦ Full & Half-time applicants must be available to attend the free, AmeriCorps hybrid class at SU alternate Thursdays, 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 p.m., during the Fall and Spring semesters.
- ♦ Must provide documentation of "citizen, national, or permanent resident alien of the United States."
- ♦ Applicants will undergo a free Criminal History Check, which includes FBI fingerprinting.
- ♦ You **DO NOT** need to be a student at Salisbury University. Anyone can participate.



What do AmeriCorps Members Do?

Members serve with a nonprofit or government agency partner site for the duration of the commitment. Members often serve in such areas as environmental education, youth development, older adult care, or financial literacy. Previous partner sites have included the City of Salisbury, Health Departments, Libraries and many more! We have a service experience fit for everyone!
