About the M.Ed. Curriculum and Instruction Program

The Master of Education (M.Ed.) Curriculum and Instruction Program provides practicing or certified teachers with personal and professional growth through graduate study. The program is designed for classroom teachers seeking opportunities for career advancement through deeper content area knowledge and expanded pedagogical expertise.

Personalized Program

Candidates create a unique focus within their own program of study. Middle and secondary school teachers can build graduate-level content area courses into their programs of study, combining content knowledge with expanded theoretical and practical teaching skills. Throughout the program, students meet with a faculty advisor

to design and implement their program plans.

Along with a customized curriculum, M.Ed. candidates take four core courses on topics crucial to current educational practice: research, diversity, learning and technology. The program culminates in a capstone course in which candidates demonstrate their ability to conduct disciplined inquiry on a topic relevant to their own teaching practice and professional development.

Program Requirements

Candidates complete 33 semester hours of graduate coursework comprised of four core education courses, electives and the capstone course. The M.Ed. program is an advanced degree program and does not lead to any teacher certification. Applicants should be licensed teachers or eligible for licensure.
