The College of Health and Human Services (CHHS) Honors Program offers a variety of enhanced courses to satisfy your interests in the areas of health and human services professions. Enrollment in the CHHS Honors Program provides you with the flexibility to complete your honors and major program requirements, as well as some General Education requirements, simultaneously while also engaging in meaningful interdisciplinary coursework. Enhanced courses are available when you're admitted to any CHHS program and have a GPA of at least a 3.5/4.0.

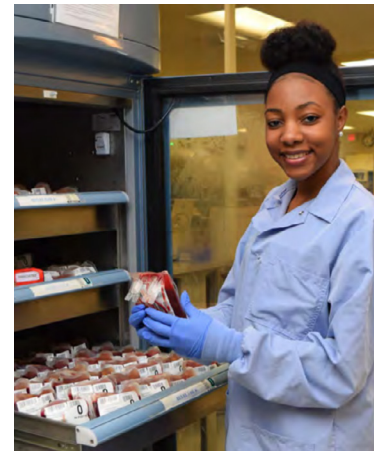
interprofessional collaborative practice enhances the health care experience, improves population health and reduces health care costs.
