If you want to tackle big ideas across multiple disciplines, you can minor in one of our Meta-Minor Programs.

#### Cognitive Science

The cognitive science minor exposes you to ideas that are at the forefront of philosophical thought and psychological inquiry, and that form the basis for modern neuroscience and information technology. In this flexible minor, there are a dozen possible foundational courses to choose from. If you have less focused interests, you may select courses from a diverse set of disciplines. However, you may also tailor the minor, creating a set of courses reflecting your particular interest, including linguistics,

cognitive neuroscience, mind and culture, and symbolic logic.

#### Ethnic and Global Literature

The ethnic and global literatures minor offers the opportunity to study literature through the lenses of varying ethnicities around the globe. Engage with issues of race, ethnicity, identity and class as you study everything from literature of the Global South to Latin America, exploring the human condition through a wide range of authors and genres.

#### Health Humanities

The health humanities minor promotes the integration of the humanities in the understanding and practice of health care and medicine. Drawing on insights from literature, philosophy, communication, psychology, sociology and other fields, the minor fosters critical reflection on the meanings of health, illness and human suffering, as well as the diversity of responses to such experiences.

#### Law, Justice and Advocacy

The law, justice and advocacy minor combines courses on politics, race, the legal system, ethics and social



justice. Ideal for those looking to attend law school after SU, you learn about the legal system, morality and social justice, and the minor helps you apply this understanding to the areas of society you care about.

#### Religious Studies

Religion has played a central role in virtually all civilizations and cultures. Throughout history, religion has expressed humanity's deepest questions, such as how to explain human suffering and injustices, as well as the true meaning of life. The religious studies minor explores the nature of religion from a variety of scholarly perspectives: anthropology, English, history, philosophy and sociology.

#### User Experience (UX)

UX is all about how people use and interact with digital screens and systems. SU's UX minor is unique because of its focus on human connection in technology. Drawing from art, psychology, philosophy, English, communication and marketing, become prepared for web and digital design by understanding human nature.
