ABOUT

The National Science Foundation (NSF) is partnering with SU to produce more mathematics and science teachers to meet one of our country's critical needs. This partnership helps SU prepare STEM majors to become exemplary middle and high school teachers.

Current SU Freshmen: Apply for Noyce Internships

- Receive a \$1,500 stipend for participating in the design, implementation and analysis of a research lesson each semester in Wicomico County with local expert teachers and other SU students.
- Optimize your chances of receiving junior- and senior-year Noyce scholarships.
- Plan to spend approximately 30 hours per semester in the internship experience.

Current SU Sophomores: Apply for Noyce Scholarships

- Receive a \$10,000 scholarship for junior year and another \$10,000 scholarship for senior year by agreeing to teach two years for each year of scholarship funding received.
- Teaching commitment after graduation may be fulfilled in Dorchester, Somerset, Wicomico or Worcester county, or any other high-need district in the U.S. approved by SU.
- Work with expert local Wicomico County STEM teachers to design, implement and analyze research lessons.
- Travel to professional conferences to present your work.
- Prepare to become a teacher by taking coursework in STEM teaching methods, technology,

classroom management and working with diverse students.

- Benefit from a professional community of Noyce peers who meet for monthly seminars and online discussions about topics that help you succeed as a STEM teacher.
- Receive regular guidance from an experienced mentor teacher and a support community of your peers as you complete your first years of teaching. Analyze teaching in your peers' classrooms by engaging in online discussion of their video recorded lessons.

To Be Eligible for Noyce Internships and Scholarships

- **Majors in Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Mathematics or Physics** can apply for the scholarship online: salisbury.academicworks.com
- To apply for the internship, email one of the faculty member listed on the right.
- Adjust your schedule to complete coursework for the SU secondary teacher preparation program, an advisor listed below can help.
- Maintain a minimum 3.0 overall GPA.



- Meet all requirements to enter SU's Professional Teacher Education Program in your junior year. salisbury.edu/explore-academics/programs/undergraduate-degreeprograms/majors/secondaryeducation.aspx
- File a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and send results to SU.
- File all application materials by June 1 to receive funds for the following academic year.
- Provide documentation of being a U.S. Citizen, National or Permanent Resident Alien.

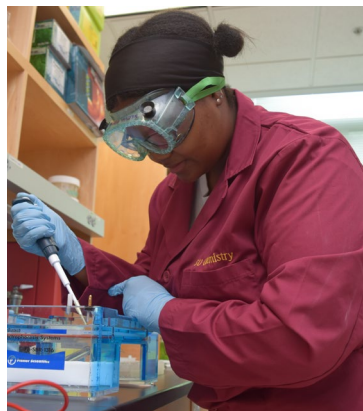
