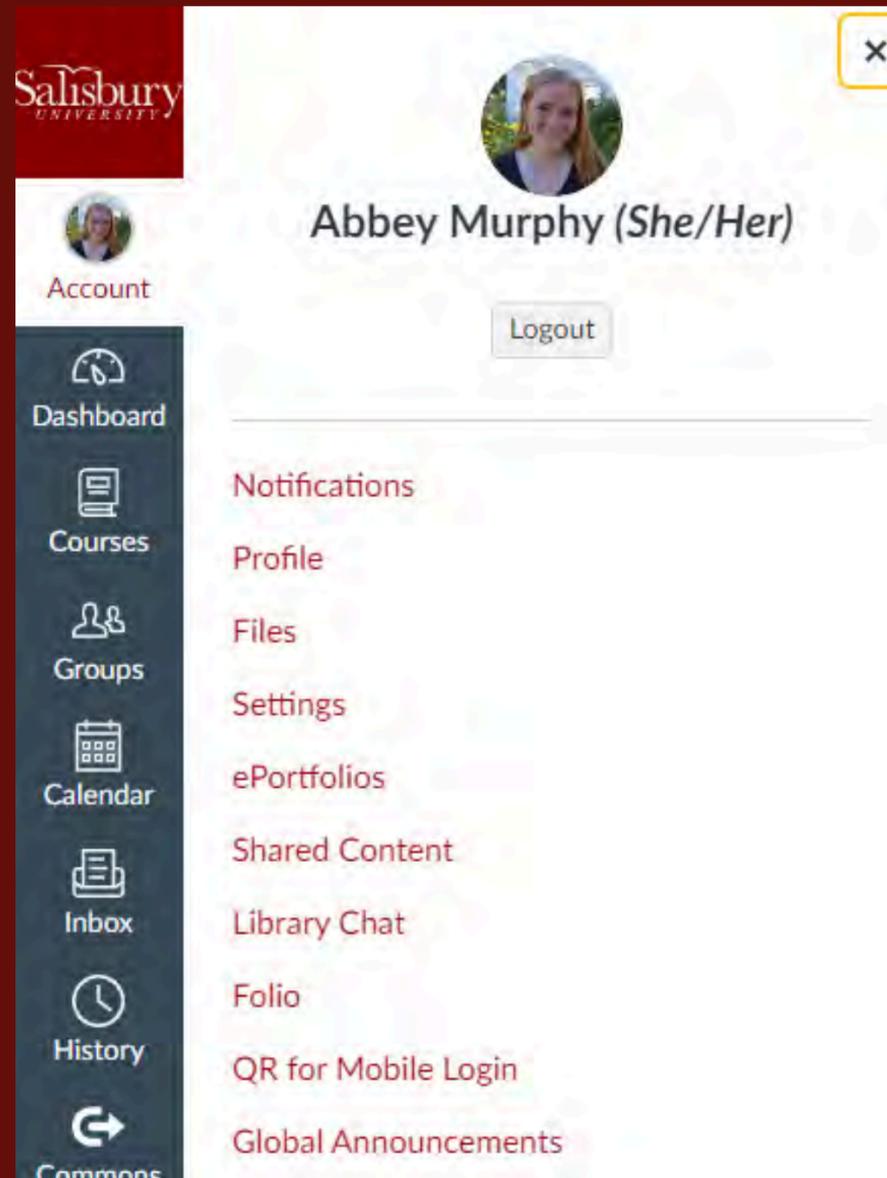

- **Hungry Minds Café and Chesapeake Bay Roasting Company**
- **MakerLab**
 - Students can check out iPads from the MakerLab, in addition to using the 3-D printers and VR tools
- **The Pit**
 - The center of the 1st floor with desktop computers, workstations and printers
- **Front Circulation Desk**
 - This area is staffed during work hours for students to ask questions, borrow materials, and get some research help in finding print materials. Students can check out laptops and other devices.
- **IT Help Desk**
 - This desk is staffed to help students with personal and SU owned technology. Students can approach the desk with their device for quick help or call IT with questions.

- **Math Emporium**
 - Staffed with tutors and students in certain degree areas to help with specific math and computer science courses homework, class work and understanding of materials
- **Center for Student Achievement (CSA)**
 - The CSA serves as a support service that is available for all students. Located here on the second floor, the CSA supports academic success by offering various programs and workshops, coaching and Supplemental Instruction (SI) tutors for those in need.
- **University Writing Center**
 - The UWC offers a place on campus where students can meet with trained peer consultants to assist them with achieving their writing potential, while working on papers and projects.

- **Self-checkout machine** located to the right of the 3rd floor elevators
- **Nabb Center for Delmarva History and Culture**
 - This is a humanities research laboratory for both SU students and local community researchers that provides resources for advanced research needs.
- **Quiet and silent study sections**
 - Every floor in the library gets increasingly quiet, meaning the 4th floor is silent. There are designated areas on the 3rd floor for quiet studying and silent studying if you ever want to work with less noise distracting you.
- **Restrooms on every floor**, in addition to an all gender restroom on 2nd floor above Hungry Minds Cafe

WHAT IS FERPA?

FERPA, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, is like your shield for keeping your personal school information private from family members. Here's what it covers:

1. **Grades and Transcripts:** Your actual grades and your academic history, like your transcripts.
2. **Personal Information:** This includes things like your name, address, social security number, and even your student ID number.
3. **Attendance Records:** Yup, even whether you showed up to class or not is protected.
4. **Disciplinary Records:** Any reports or records related to any kind of disciplinary action taken against you.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

Basically, if it's something about you and your education, chances are FERPA's got it covered. And it's there to make sure that only the people who really need to know have access to that info, like you, your parents (if you're under 18), or school officials who need it to help you out. So, feel free to breathe easy knowing that your school stuff is safe and sound, thanks to FERPA!

WHAT IF I DON'T FILL OUT THE FERPA WAIVER?

Privacy Protection: Without the waiver, SU won't be able to share any of your academic or personal information with your families. This means they won't be able to see your grades, schedule, or even basic stuff like whether you're attending classes or not.

Communication Barriers: If there's an issue with your grades or anything else important, SU won't be able to discuss it with your families unless you give them permission. So, if your families call the school asking about how you're doing, SU can't really say much.
