Requirements for Admissions —Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program

To help you make tomorrow yours at SU, we share with you the two-step process you need follow to apply to and be considered for acceptance into our Nursing Program:

- You've already completed the first step: being officially admitted to SU!
- Second, you must complete the steps below in your sophomore year to be considered for acceptance into the Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program. This step is a competitive process and is based on the evaluation of your overall qualifications by the School of Nursing Student Policies Committee. Please note, admission to the University does not guarantee acceptance to the Nursing Program.

All students are considered on a *competitive and space-available basis*. To be considered for admission to upper-division nursing courses beginning in the fall of your junior year, current and prospective students must:

- Complete, or have a plan to complete, all nursing prerequisite coursework with no more than one grade lower than a C (HLSC 301-Pathophysiology and lab must be completed with a C or better). The nursing prerequisite courses that must be completed PRIOR to beginning required nursing courses include: BIOL 211 - Microbiology and lab, BIOL 215 - Anatomy and Physiology I and lab, BIOL 216 - Anatomy and Physiology II and lab, HLSC 255 - Nutrition for the Health Sciences, HLSC 301 - Pathophysiology and lab, CHEM 121 - General Chemistry I and lab, CHEM 122 – General Chemistry II and lab, and PSYC 200 - Developmental Psychology.
- Complete the Application for the Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program directly in the Centralized Application Service (CAS) at www.nursingcas.org by January 15 of the sophomore year.
- Register for, schedule and complete the Evolve Reach Admission Assessment Exam (A2) at a Prometrics testing center between November 1 and January 1 of the sophomore year.

Decisions regarding acceptance into the Traditional Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program are generally shared by March 1. Applicants who are accepted to the program must complete all prerequisite courses prior to the start of the Nursing Program. In addition, completed transcripts must be submitted to the CAS two business weeks prior to the start of the nursing program (failure to do so may result in the loss of a seat in the program).
