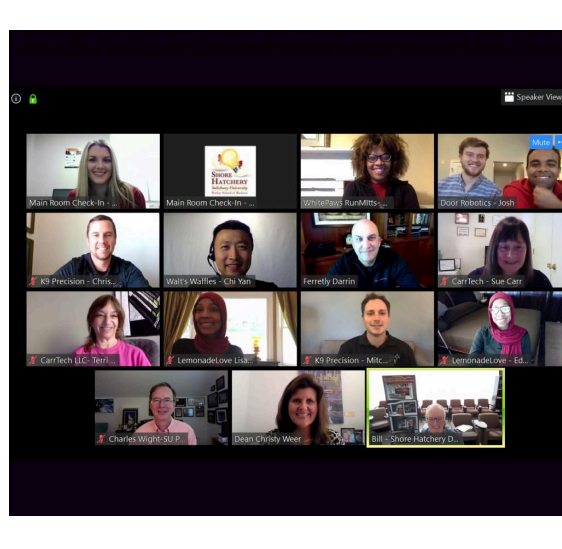

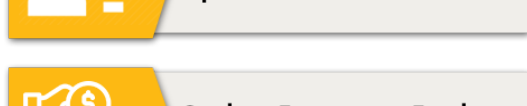
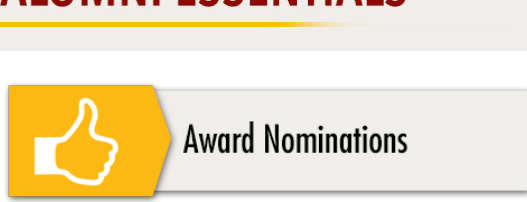


Sea Gull Century Goes Virtual

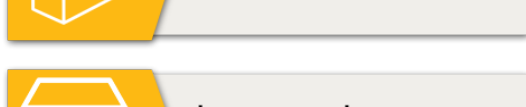
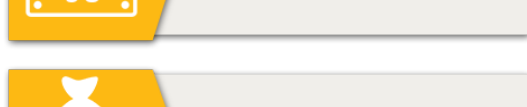
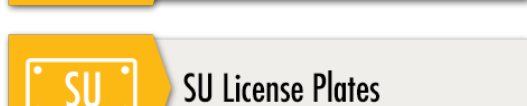
