College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP)

The College Assistance Migrant Program (CAMP) is a federal program that assists students from migrant, seasonal or temporary farmworker backgrounds. The program provides academic, financial, medical and social support to students enrolled in their first year of undergraduate studies at colleges and universities.



At Salisbury University, students who qualify for CAMP can take advantage of the I'M³ POWER CAMP Scholars Program, a Seidel School of Education program that provides financial and educational support regardless of major.
