5. Why did some service members stationed abroad have a negative impression of the Red Cross?
6. What assistance did the American Red Cross provide during the Influenza pandemic of 1918?
How are they assisting in the current COVID-19 pandemic?
7. Why did Dr. Charles Drew resign from his post with the American Red Cross? Provide an example of another discriminatory medical policy or practice established on the basis of race or gender.
8. What was the cost to enroll in Red Cross membership in 1925?
9. Why do you think Maryland State Teachers College (now Salisbury University) offered ambulance and stretcher training exercises on campus in the 1940s?
10. What does Jeanne Severance describe doing as a Red Cross volunteer in India in 1945? Why do you think she was serving in India during that time?
