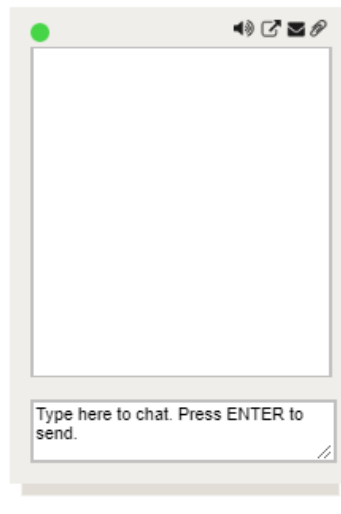
## SCHEDULE FOR BREAK

**Did You Know?** The earliest mention of Chanukah or Hanukkah, the Jewish Festival of Lights, in the *New York Times* was on December 12, 1863. The article described the "'Chanuka' Fancy Dress Ball and Masquerade" held the previous Tuesday. The first mention in the *Baltimore Sun* occurred on December 24, 1859, in a story about a ceremony at Har Sinai Temple on High Street. You can read the stories by searching for "Chanukah" or "Chanuka" in the *Historical New York Times* and the *Historical Baltimore Sun* databases, found under "H" in the A-to-Z database list.
