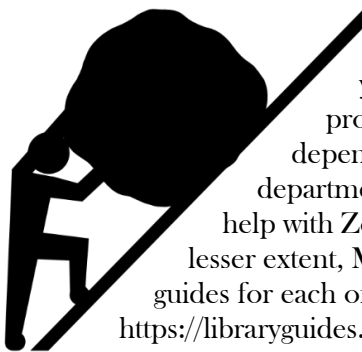

Charging devices

Have a laptop or other device that runs out of juice while you are on campus? Did you know that the SU Libraries lend charging kits? Available for 3-hour loans, the charging kits include a battery pack and 3 cables: a USB-C cable, a lightning cable, and a micro USB cable. We also have Apple charging kits available, both an Apple 85W MagSafe 2 power adapter and an Apple 87W USB-C power adapter. You can check these kits out at the Library Service Desk on the first floor of the GAC. If you have suggestions for any other chargers that might be helpful, feel free to mention it at the Desk. We can't promise we'll be able to get them, but we'll consider it.



Managing Your Citations



Are you having trouble keeping track of all the citations of your research papers or projects? Did you know there are several citation management programs available to you? Which one you choose depends on personal preference and what your major department may require. The SU Libraries can offer you help with Zotero, ProQuest RefWorks, EndNote, and, to a lesser extent, Mendeley. We have LibGuides or links to usage guides for each of these, and you can find them linked from <https://libraryguides.salisbury.edu/citation/citationsoftware>.
