SOME STUDY SPACES

The Pit is centrally located on the 1st floor and has lots of computers and two printers (there are printers by the classrooms at the SE and NW corners of the 1st floor, too).

Group Studies are on the 2nd floor. They are reservable online or at the door. They are meant for—you got it—groups of two or more. If one person is occupying a group study, even if that person has a reservation, a group may claim the room.

Quiet/Silent Study is available in the 3rd floor reading rooms where most of our books are. While there are no individual study rooms, there are big individual carrels along the windows and elsewhere in the two rooms. There are a few computers and a printer in the SW corner.
