Make It at the MakerLab!

The SU Libraries MakerLab is open every day and is available to all students across SU. If you don't know how to use any of the equipment, the staff can provide training. You'll find the MakerLab in the southeast corner of the first floor of the GAC (near Perdue Hall). Here are some of the services and/or equipment available:



3D printing: We have a variety of 3D printers and materials available.

3D scanning: We have both a handheld and a stationary scanner.

Laser cutting and engraving: You can cut or engrave plywood, acrylic, leather, and other materials using our Glowforge laser cutter/engraver.

Virtual reality/augmented reality equipment: We have VR headsets and a 360-degree camera available for checkout.

Laminating: You can laminate either 8.5" x 11" or 11" x 17" paper on our laminator.

Button making: You can make your own custom buttons, either 1.25" or 2.25" in diameter.

Need Help with Research?

Struggling to get started finding sources for that research paper or other project? You can make an appointment for an in-depth research consultation with a librarian! Each department has a librarian assigned to it as liaison, and that librarian can help you.
