Taylor and Francis eBooks

This new collection of full-text eBooks may be accessed from the Libraries' A-Z Database List as well as from Research Port. The interdisciplinary subjects include China, Culture and Ethnicity, Ethics, Globalization, Human Rights, the Internet, Korea, Race and Ethnicity, Sexuality Studies, Social and Cultural Theory, and Urban Studies. It is easy to filter results to show only those e-books that we have access to by clicking a box in the upper left-hand corner of the results screen. Results show entire books as well as chapters containing information on the search topic.
